My Lord Duke,

I have the honour to transmit herewith a Form of Particulars required for the computation of pension payable to Mr. R. K. M. Kate, 2nd Grade Clerk in the Postal Department, who has been pronounced unfit for further service in this Colony by a Medical Board held on him in India on the 12th of January last. A copy of the proceedings of the Medical Board is enclosed for Your Grace's information.

2. Mr. Kate's service date from the 10th July, 1908, and he is, therefore, eligible for a pension in respect of fourteen completed years of service. The pension is computed at Shs:1459/56 per annum with effect from the 26th January, 1923, inclusive.

3. Pending the receipt of Your Grace's sanction to the pension recommended, I have authorized the grant to Mr. Kate of an alimentary allowance at the rate of Shs:1152/- per annum from the date quoted.

Instructions

INSTRUCTIONS REFERRED TO ON PAGE 1.

If this Paper of Particulars and the Certificates connected with it, be not sent in original, the copies must be duly attested.

HEAD 1.—In the case of an Officer serving on the West Coast of Africa, a statement is to be added whether he has retired from Office. (Colonial Regulations, § 400.)

HEAD 2.—State the description of Allowance for which the Applicant is recommended, viz. Superannuation, Compensation, Commutation Allowance, or Gratuity, and its amount. In the case of Pension, claim all credits to their Pension in respect of Professional or other special qualifications, this should be stated, and a reference should be given to the authority under which the claim is made.

HEAD 3.—If the service has been interrupted by one or more breaks, the word "breaks" should be added before or after the number of years and months, and the nature, dates, and circumstances of the break or breaks should be stated under heading 9.

HEAD 4.—If the Pensioner has been in receipt of the same Salary, or in the class from which he retired, for the 36 months immediately before the date of his retirement, the actual annual rate of Salary or Wages at that date should be inserted, preceded by the word "actual." In other cases the average annual amount of Salary or Wages for the 36 months next preceding the date of retirement should be inserted, preceded by the word "average," but if the whole period of service is less than three years, then the average for the whole period of service should be inserted.

HEAD 5.—A separate statement should be inserted of the average Annual Value, for the 36 months immediately preceding retirement, of such Emoluments (exclusive of salary or wages) which is claimed to be included in the calculation of the Pension or Gratuity.

Whenever the value of a House or Honor Allowance, as ascertained, exceeds one-sixth of the salary and other emoluments which count for Pension purposes, it is to be reduced to one-sixth of that amount, so that it shall not exceed one-seventh of the whole.

Fees which an officer is allowed to retain for his own use will be taken into account in Pension purposes, with regular salary, at the annual average of the net receipts of the 36 months next preceding the Officer's retirement. These net receipts are to be ascertained by deducting from the gross amount of Fees such Office Expenses, &c., as an officer may have had to defray from his own resources in performing the services for which he was remunerated by Fees. No deduction, however, from the Fees should be made in respect of Office Expenses provided from Public Funds for the Discharge of those duties in which a Fixed Salary is assigned. Papers of "Particulars" when forwarded to the Colonial Department should be accompanied by formal declarations from the retiring Officers, showing the amount received by them for fees, and the amount debited to them for Office Expenses, &c., in each of the three years immediately preceding the retirement. It will be the duty of the Colonial Government concerned to satisfy themselves of the accuracy of such statements before forwarding them to the Colonial Office. In the case of Officers receiving Fixed Salaries and Fees, the Fees will not in ordinary circumstances be allowed to count for Pension purposes to the extent of more than one-quarter of the Salaries, and Fees will not in any case be allowed to count for Pension purposes during any period in which the whole time of the Officer serving there was not given to the Public Service.

HEAD 6.—In the case of an Officer, if the applicant is below the ordinary age for retirement, a Medical Certificate as to his physical condition that he is disqualified by infirmity of mind or body for discharging the duties of his situation, and that such infirmity is likely to be permanent.

In cases of ten years' service or more, this certificate should be signed by two Officers, whom at least one should, if possible, be a Salaried Officer of the Government.

HEAD 7.—As to "acting" service see Head 8.

If the applicant has had any "acting" service, the details must be fully given, with a statement whether or not, during the "acting" service, he was connected with the permanent Civil Service of the Colony.

HEAD 8.—If, in special circumstances, a professional Civil Officer has been allowed to have "private practice" without forfeiting his claim to Pension, the facts are to be fully stated.

HEAD 9.—If the Applicant is liable to any deduction from his service under Clause 102 of the Colonial Regulations, the facts should be fully stated.

HEAD 10.—The length of service and other particulars of the computation are to be given. When an average of Salary, &c., is taken, the mode of calculating it (whether by months, &c.) is to be explained.
