In continuation of my despatch No. 1016 of the 28th instant transmitting 10 copies of the First Supplementary Estimates 1923 I have the honour to make the following observations.

2.

Your Grace will observe that provision has been necessary for Personal Emoluments under many heads of Estimates, the excesses being due to the fact that the Estimates were framed on the assumption that there would be a decrease in Asiatic Salaries. It has not yet been possible to estimate the expenditure that will be incurred by payment of Asiatic Leave Salaries and pensions in accordance with the instructions conveyed in Your Grace's Confidential despatch dated 29th December, 1922, and reference to this unascertained liability is to be found in paragraphs 9 and 16 of the Treasurer's Statement.

3.

The details of excesses are dealt with in the Treasurer's memorandum and need no further explanation. I would mention only the provision of £7000 made for Repairs and Renewals of Roads and Bridges under Head XXIX Public Works Extraordinary; the abnormal rains during April and May have damaged the roads throughout the colony to such an extent that it is now realized that the provision made will be insufficient and that further amounts will be required in subsequent Supplementary

Head XXV. Miscellaneous

(i) I note that provision is now made under this head for the sum of £100 for compensation for the loss of ~~officials'~~ private effects, and that in the explanatory memorandum it is stated to be the practice to compensate officials who cannot effect insurance, for losses of private property which are sustained ~~in~~ due to their own negligence.

I would however wish you to note that it was stated in para. 2 of Mr Churchill's despatch No 1408

of the 29th September 1922, that the Govt. should make it clearly known that it would accept

no liability for loss which could have been covered by insurance, that para. ~~obviously~~ appears to have been read as implying that in cases where it was not possible to effect insurance, compensation would be paid by the Govt.

This construction ~~is~~ was by no means intended and the payment ^{by Government} of compensation for loss of private property even where no insurance could have been effected, is not a matter of practice but one for submission to the Secretary of State, for the consideration of each case upon its merits. It should be clearly understood that the payment

of compensation in any case

is not to be approved without

^{prior}
reference to me.
