My Lord Duke,

I have the honour to refer to the correspondence terminating with Mr. Churchill's despatch No. 935 of the 18th June 1922/oh the subject of an exchange of and librater the Algao Saw Mills, Limited, and the Rigero tribe.

- 2. The proposal approved in your predecessor's telegram of the 16th April 1922, related to the exchange of approximately 95 acres of land reserved for the use of the Elgayo tribe for an approximate area of 55 acres ferming part of a farm (No.201/1) belonging to the Algao Saw Eills, Limited.
- 3. It has now been found by survey that the areas in question extend to 110 acres and 65 acres respectively, but it has been represented that the exchange is still in favour of the natives, who in place of 110 acres of waterless forest which is of no prectical use to them in their present state of civilization, are to receive 65 acres containing salt licks greatly nevered by them for their cattle, and access to a demobility and maintained by the Algae Saw Mills which will open up to them an additional 5000 acres of their grazing hitherto almost weeless through lack of water.
- 4. Acting upon the advice of the District
  Officers concerned, as well as that of Executive Council,
  I have approved of the citaration, subject to four Grace's
