I have the honour to acknowledge the receipt of Your Grace's despatch of December 21st, 1922, on the subject of the insertion in the Colonial Services Estimate 1923 - 4 of the sum of 25,000 in respect of the cost of deligating the new boundary between Kenya and Italian so califacting the new boundary between th

- 2. In submitting the following proposals on this atter I have assumed that only such preliminary survey as is essential is to be made at present and that the expenditure incurred is to be reduced to a minimum.
- 3. With a view to economy, I recommend that this survey should be carried out departmentally. The establishment of this Colony includes two relief District Surveyors who could be spared for the work in 1923 24 without undue curtailment or postponement of leave. One of them will certainly be available in 1925 and, if the other cannot be spared, a Licensed Surveyor could be temporarily engaged.
- 4. The cost of importing a special survey party from England would obviously be very great as continuous work throughout the year is impossible owing to lack of water. During the dry season a party from England would be without employment, and would presumably return to

 - (b) By running this portion of the boundary without determining its exact geographical position.
