Dear Bishop of Derby,

We have now heard the result of the trial  
(8.45 today):

"Abraham case concluded yesterday evening  
Wednesday. All four accused found guilty of  
grossly hurting without provocation.  
Abraham sentenced to two years' rigorous  
imprisonment. Native accused sentenced to  
one day."

I was confident that the Magistrate's committal  
on the charge of murder would not stand; as regards the  
Judge's sentence I need not - and would rather not -  
express any opinion.

Please do not decide about going to East Africa  
till you hear from us. Two years is a long time for  
imprisonment in the tropics and your son may be sent  
home. We will find out about this and let you know.
