excisions have since been made, were set aside as Mative Reserves under the Outlying Districts Ordinance 1902, which was the only means then available of making such reservations.

With regard to the Colonial Office note against Schedule 3 No.4, I have to state that Schedule 3 No.6, of Sir Edward Northey's despatch No. 1084 of the 8th August, 1922, was inaccurate in stating that the Lumbwa Reserve boundaries were definitely adjusted in 1919. The Notice which appears on page 510 of the Official Gazette of that year was provisional only. The boundaries had been previously defined by proclamation under the Outlying Districts Ordinance of 1902. This Proclamation was dated the 10th April, 1909, and appears on page 190 of the Official Gazettes of that year. It would appear that the large excision which was made in 1919 in the Lumbwa Reserve by the direction of Sir Edward Northey was not reparted to the maretary of State. A separate despatch on this matter as in course of preparation in raply to paragraph 3 of Your 348/Grace's Confidential despatch of October 31st last.

In connection with the Colonial Office note against Schedule 3, No.5, I have to state that this correctly represents the case as reported in Sir Edward Northey's despatch No.679 of the 26th May last, but the Chief Mative Commissioner points out, and the records here show, that his opposition to the excision of a large area from the Nandi Reserve was only withdrawn in view of a statement made to him personally by Sir E.Northey, which would appear to have been based upon misleading information supplied to Sir Edward.
