LEAVE REGULATIONS FOR KENYA EUROPEAN CONSTABLES ENGAGED ON AGREEMENT IN ENGLAND

I.—Subject to the necessities of the service, constables may, after a tour of residential service, be granted vacation leave with full pay for the time necessarily taken on the journey to England, plus 3* days for each completed calendar month of residential service; and if especially detained by the Government on public grounds after the completion of a tour of 30 months! service they may be granted vacation leave for 3* days more with full pay in respect of each completed calendar month that they may have been detained.

In the case of constables who are returning to East Africa for further service, there may be added to their vacation leave a further period of leave with full pay, known as "return leave," for 3* days for each completed calendar month of residential service, plus the time necessarily taken on the journey from England. Constables to whom return leave is granted will be required to sign an agreement to the effect that in the event of their failing to return to East Africa for further service they will, if called upon to do so, refund the amount of any pay drawn in respect of such leave, and that in the event of their returning to East Africa for further service but determining the engagement with the approval of the Commissioner or being discharged under Clause 12 (a), (c) or (f) of the foregoing Schedule before the completion of a further tour of service, they will, if called upon to do so, refund the amount of any pay drawn in respect of such leave or such part of that pay as the Government may direct, together with the cost of their return passage from England or such part thereof as the Government may direct.

II. Constables invalided before completing a tour of service of 20 months may be granted sick leave, with full pay, for the time necessarily taken on the journey to England, plus 3* days in respect of each completed calendar month of residential service.

In addition to the sick leave which may be granted under the foregoing regulation, if there is reason to believe that a constable will ultimately be fit to return to East Africa for duty, and if the Government desires to retain his services for a further tour, he may be granted "return sick leave" with full pay for 3* days more (making 6+ days in all) in respect of each completed calendar month of residential service, plus the time necessarily taken on the journey from England, subject to the same conditions with regard to repayment as return leave.

Ne extension of vacation leave will be granted in the ordinary course, but in exceptional the asstances, such as continued ill-health, constables who are not returning may be granted an extension f leave at the discretion of the Secretary of State for a period not exceeding six calendar months, ith such salary as the Secretary of State may direct.

1V. In addition to the sick leave which may be granted under the foregoing regulation, if there is reason to believe that a constable will ultimately be fit to return to Bast Africa for duty, and if the Government desires to retain his services for a further tour, he may be granted "return sick leave" with full pay for 3 days more (making 6 days in all) in respect of each completed calendarmenth of residential service, plus the time necessarily taken on the journey from England, subject to the same conditions with regard to repayment as return leave.

- VI. Forthe purpose of reckoning the amount of leave due to a Constable, residential service is taken to begin on the day on which he arrives at Nembasa and to end on the day preceding that on which he leaves Mombasa.

My Lord Duke,

In continuation of paragraph 2 of my despatch No.1401 of even date, and with reference to paragraph 2 of Mr. Churchill's despatch No.952 of June 29th, 1922, I have the honour to transmit herewith for Your Grace's consideration a iraft form of agreement which has been prepared for use in the case of European Police Constables who are engaged locally.

- 2. This form follows that transmitted with my despatch under reference as closely as possible, suitable adjustments being made where occasion demands them in consideration of the fact that the engagement is made in this assisting and not in England.
- The main alterations in principle occur in respect of Passages, Leave and Sick Leave. In clause 7 of the draft, the provision in a passage to England at Government expense has been made continuent on the completion of a tear of service and in agreement in the part of the Driville and the Government as to re-engagement for further service. I see no course for the provision of a free passage to Constating Angages locally unless these unlitting have been folicities.

The proposed regulations are based on the principles that, if the officer is to be re-engaged for further service, leave should normally be taken in England and that, if the officer is not to be re-engaged, the vacation leave which is due to him on the completion of a tour of service will be accompanied by no privileges regarding a passage to England Provision has been inserted for the refund of certain payments made on behalf of the officer in the event of the agreement to perform further service being broken by the officer.

- the provision of a passage to England should be offered to a locally engaged officer unless there is reason to believe that the officer will ultimately be fit to return to duty and unless the Government desires to retain his services, and I have altered paragraph III of the draft leave regulations accordingly. I have considered it unnecessary to provide for extensions of vacation leave to locally engaged officers.
- 6. I should be glad to receive Your Grace's approval of this Schedule of Leave Regulations for general application to European officers who are engaged in this country.

AGREEMENT IN KENYA COLONY
AND PROTECTORATE.

I. Subject to the necessities of the service, officers may, after a tour of residential service, be granted vacation leave with full pay for 3[†] days for each completed calendar month of residential service; and if especially detained by the Government on public grounds after the completion of a tour of 30 months' service they may be grantedvacation leave for 3[‡] days more with full pay in respect of each completed calendar month that they may have been detained.

II. In the case of efficers who are returning to East Africa for further service, officers may, after a tour of residential service, and surject to the measurement of the service, he granted vacation leave with full pay for the time necessarily taken on the journey to England plus 3 days for each completed calendar month of residential service; and if especially detained by the Government on public grounds after the completion of a 30 months service, they may be granted vacation leave for 3 days more with full pay in respect of each completed calendar month that they may have been detained.

In such cases, there may be added to their vacation leave a further period of leave with full pay, known as "return leave" for 3 the days
