279 25th September. Your despatch 5th June Confidential Indian Member of the Executive Council. I have interviewed Varma Member of the Indian delegation to London and cordially invited his co-operation. He declined to accept nomination to fill up the vacancy and states view strongly held by local Indians is that no Indian will accept seat on the Executive council or assist in implementing the decision in command paper until local Indian Congress receives instructions from India on the attitude it is to adopt. Before my return Bowring invited Malik temporary Indian Member of the Legislative Council to sit on the Executive council but I received a reply exactly similar to that of Varma. I understand that this is the case and in the circumstances I cannot make nomination to fill the vacancy. I am considering in Executive Council draft bill amending Legislative council Ordinance of 1919 and I am inviting suggestions as to qualifications and arrangements for constituency occupied by Indian Congress and Arabs. substance of these will be telegraphed to you as soon as ascertained. Braft Bill will be posted to you at once. I am taking action on the remaining points of your despatch of 9th August. The general feeling in the Colony as to command paper is quite satisfactory.
