In continuation of paragraph 3 of my Confidential despatch No. 510 of the 15th September, 1923, I have the honour to transmit a copy of a memorandum from the General Manager, Uganda Railway, explaining the grounds of his recommendations for improving the emoluments of certain officers of his staff connected with the re-organization of the Uganda Railway.

2. I would observe that the District Engineer stationed at Nairobi is in effect Assistant Chief Engineer in the absence of the Chief Engineer when the latter is on leave or absence from the country. The District Engineer has, however, to be observed that he does not wish at the present time to put forward any proposals for a change in his remuneration ~~the amount~~ of his post.

3. I would also refer to the fact that the Railway Press is at present being published on a weekly basis at a cost of £2400-£220-£500-25-£600 per annum, as stated in Mr. Churchill's despatch No. 1361 of the 20th September, 1922.

Reorganisation of the Uganda Railway.
ref. your No. S/P. 32961/23 dated 3rd June, 1923.

I have the honour to acknowledge the receipt of your letter of the 3rd June, 1923, in relation to the proposed reorganisation of the Uganda Railway, and in reply to inform you that the same has been forwarded to the relevant authorities for their consideration.

Senior District Engineers' Salaries

It is noted that you propose to increase the salaries of Senior District Engineers from £1,400 to £2,500 per annum. This proposal is being considered in the light of the fact that the proposed reorganisation will result in a reduction of the number of Senior District Engineers. It is suggested that the salaries of the Senior District Engineers who remain in the service should be increased to £2,000 per annum, which would be in line with the proposed scale for the post of Senior District Engineer. The other Senior District Engineers who are to be transferred to other posts should remain on their present scale, i.e. £1,400-£2,500.

(c) Senior District Engineer (Administrative) Salary

£2,000-£4,000

In paragraph 12 (c) of my letter of the 3rd June, I recommended that Mr. McHardy's designation of "Senior District Engineer" should be changed to "Senior District Engineer (Administrative)" and I now recommend that the scale for this post should be £2,000-£4,000 and that Mr. McHardy should enter his new scale next year.
