My Lord Duke,

I have the honour to transmit herewith a form of particulars required for the computation of pension payable to Mr. Leandro de Mello, 1st Grade Clerk, Administration, who has been pronounced unfit for further service in this Colony by a Medical Board held on him in Delhi on the 7th August last. A copy of the proceedings of this Board is enclosed for Your Grace's information.

2. Mr. de Mello's services date from the 24th March, 1903, and he is, therefore, eligible for a pension in respect of twenty completed years. The pension is computed at Shs. 2,568/- a year with effect from the 15th August, 1923, inclusive.

3. Pending the receipt of Your Grace's sanction to a pension recommended, I have authorized the payment to Mr. de Mello of an alimentary allowance at the rate of Shs. 2,040/- a year with effect from the date quoted.

10.—In the case of an Officer serving on the High Seas or Africa, a statement is to be added respecting the amount of his Naval Officers' Pay.

11.—In the case of an Officer who holds the rank of Subaltern or equivalent, or of an equivalent rank in the Royal Engineers or Artillery and is abroad. In the case of Pioneers serving on the Frontier in support of Infantrymen or other special qualifications, the same is to be added, and a statement should be given to the authority under which the claim is made.

12.—In the case of an Officer serving on land frontier, the word "troops" should be substituted in place of the words "all men paid monthly and the name, date, and circumstances of the service, as might be well or enough to satisfy the enquiry.

13.—In the case of an Officer serving in command of the same battery or in the class from which he takes his rank, the 10 months immediately preceding the date of his application, the actual average rate of Salary.

14.—In the case of an Officer serving on land frontier, the word "average" is to be inserted preceding the date of his application, provided that the word "actual" is also used to average current amounts of salary, or wages, for the 10 months immediately preceding the date of his application, provided that the word "average" is used if the whole period of service is less than three years, and the average for the whole period of service should be inserted.

15.—An Officer serving directly in command of the average District Troops, for the 10 months immediately preceding the date of his application, of such Battalions (regiments of infantry or cavalry) which is claimed to be entitled to the privilege of the Honour of Cavalry.

16.—Prove the value of all Troops or Horse Equipment, or armament, arms, cavalry, &c., the value paid, and the number which may be required, provided that the same is to be reduced to one-half, unless otherwise, as shall be fully explained in the whole.

17.—Any officer or official is allowed to assess for his pay, one will be taken into account for Payroll purposes, with regard either to the general average of the net amount of the 10 months immediately preceding the officer's paymonth. Those 10 months are to be reckoned by deduction from the gross amount of Payroll of Office Expenses, but, as no officer may have had 10 months from his entry into service, in preferring the estimate for which he was compensated by Payroll, the deduction, however, from the sum should be made in respect of Office Expenses provided for "Actual Payroll" for the last six months of those months to which a Payroll Battery is attached. Payroll Expenses" when forwarded to the Colonial Department should be accompanied by full descriptions from the existing Officer showing the amounts received by him for his pay, and the amount deducted of allowances by Office Expenses, so, in each of the three years immediately preceding the estimation, to add to the duty of the Colonial Government concerned to make arrangements for the payment of such amounts to those respectively due to the Colonial Office by the sum of allowances received from the Payroll and from the Payroll will not in either arrangement be allowed to exceed the amount for Payroll purposes in the extent of more than one quarter of the difference, and these will not in any case be allotted to assist for Payroll purposes during any period in which the officer serving in the Office receiving them was not given to the Payroll Service.


