Instructions

REGULATIONS REFERRED TO ON PAGE 1

In this Paper of Regulations and the Conditions mentioned
to be met upon its adoption, the copies shall be fully printed.

Rule 1.—In the case of an Officer retiring on the West Coast of Africa, a statement is to be submitted to the Civil Service Commission, (Colonial Regulations, § 400).

Rule 2.—When the Regulations of Application for which the Applicant is recommended, are Regulations of the Commission, Commission of Officers, or University, and the applicant, in the case of the Commission, is a member of the Commission, or a member of the University, or other similar institution, the Regulations shall be printed, and a reference shall be given to the authority under which the Regulations are issued.

Rule 3.—When service has been interrupted by one or more breaks, the word "broken" should be used before or after the number of years and months, and the names, dates, and circumstances of such or breaks should be stated under heading 3.

Rule 4.—If the Applicant has been in receipt of the same Salary, or in the case from which he was to be appointed, immediately before the date of his retirement, the actual period of service in that office should be stated, provided by the word "actual," in other cases, the actual period of service should be stated, provided by the word "actual," but if the whole period of service is less than three years, three years should be stated for the whole period of service should be stated.

Rule 5.—A separate statement should be inserted in the Regulations, for the 20 months immediately preceding retirement, of such Emoluments (including of salary or wages), which is required to be included in the statement of the Pension or University.

Where the value of a Pension of such Allowance, or annuity, exceeds, exceeds the salary and other emoluments which were received for Pension purposes, it is to be reduced to such of that salary, so that it shall not exceed one-third of the whole.

That which an Officer is allowed to receive for his Army or Navy will be taken into account Pension purposes, with regular salary, as the actual average of the net receipts of the 20 months immediately preceding the Officer's retirement. "Net" net receipts are to be ascertained by deducting from the gross amount of Fees such Office Expenses, as an Officer may have had to pay for his own expenses, in performing the services for which he was recommended by the Commission, before the Fees should be made in respect of Office Expenses payable to Public Funds for the use of the Office to which a Fixed Salary is assigned. The Commission should be forwarded to the Colonial Department should be accompanied by the Emoluments from the retiring Office, showing the amount received by them for 20 months immediately before the Office Expenses, as such of the 20 months immediately preceding the retirement. It will be the duty of the Colonial Department to ascertain the amount of the average of such emoluments before forwarding them to the Colonial Department. Rule 6.—In case of infirmity, if the applicant is below the ordinary age for retirement, a Medical Certificate is to be furnished showing that he is incapacitated by infirmity of mind or body for discharging duties of his situation, and that such infirmity is likely to be permanent.

In case of two years' service or more, this certificate should be signed by two Officers, who at least one should, if possible, be a National Officer of the Government.

Rule 7.—As to "broken" service see Rule 3.

If the applicant has had any "acting" service, the details must be fully stated whether or not, during the "acting" service, he was recommended with the Civil Service of the Colony.

Rule 8.—If, in special circumstances, a professional Civil Officer has been allowed to have "acting" service, the details must be fully stated.

Rule 9.—If the applicant is liable to any deduction from his service under Clause 10 of the Regulations, the facts should be fully stated.

Rule 10.—The length of service and other particulars of the applicant's service should be stated in full, and the date of his appointment to the office should be stated.

Rule 1—The name of an Officer entering in the West Coast of Africa, a statement to be filled in by a survey of that Coast. (Colonial Regulations, 1880.)

Rule 2—About the Description of Education for which the Applicant is recommended, an Examination Commission, Commissioned Officers, or District, and to answer. In the case of the Commission, an affidavit to that Purpose in support of Professional or other special qualifications, should be stated, and a reference should be given to the authority under which the same is made.

Rule 3—If the applicant has been recommended by one or more bodies, the word "bodies" should be written in after the subject of recommendation, and all names, terms, and circumstances of each or bodies should be stated under heading 3.

Rule 4—If the Person entering has been or is in the case before which he was to the 30 months immediately before the date of his engagement, the actual annual rate of his wages at that date should be inserted, provided the word "actual" in other cases, average annual amount of Salary or Wages for the 30 months next preceding the date of engagement should be inserted, provided by the word "average," but if the whole period of more than three years, then the average for the whole period of service should be inserted.

Rule 5—A complete statement should be inserted of the average Annual Value, for the 30 months immediately preceding engagement, of such Emoluments (exclusive of salary or wages) which is claimed to be paid in the satisfaction of the Pension or Gratuity.

Whereas the value of a House of Estate, or business, or occupation, or trade, or any other property and other engagements which exist for Pension purposes, is to be reduced to such of the value, as that it shall not exceed one-fourth of the whole.

From which the value is allowed to exist, for his own use will be taken into account Pension purposes, with regular value, in the annual average of the net receipts of the 30 months next preceding the Officer's engagement. These net receipts are to be ascertained by deducting from the gross Receipts of the said House, or business, or any other such property, the sum of his own expenses, in participating in the business for which he was recommended by the Commission, or from the said House, or in other respects, in which a Public Trust for the discharge of those duties to which a Public Salary is attached, or "Expenses" which are allowed in the Colonial Department should be accompanied by a statement from the receiving Officer, showing the amount received by them, for fees, and amounts deducted at other for Office Expenses, &c., in each of the three years immediately preceding the engagement. It will be the duty of the Colonial Government to examine the accuracy of such statements before forwarding them to the Colonial Office. In the case of Officers receiving Public Salaries and Fees, the Fee will not be taken into account in the average of net receipts for Pension purposes in the absence of more than one year of the Salaries, and Fees will not in any case be allowed to count for Pension purposes during a period in which the whole term of the Officer receiving them was not given to the Public Service.

Rule 6—In case of infirmity, if the applicant is below the ordinary age for retirement, a Medical Certificate is to be furnished showing that he is incapacitated by infirmity of mind or body for discharging duties of his situation, and that such infirmity is likely to be permanent.

In case of any special service or work, the certificate should be signed by two Officers, where at least one should, if possible, be a Superior Officer of the Government.

Rule 7—In the "bodies" service see Rule 3.

If the applicant has had any "acting" service, the details must be fully given, and statement whether or not, during the "acting" service, he was concerned with the Public Civil Service of the Colony.

Rule 8—It is special circumstances, a professional Civil Officer has been recommended, a public service, or other service, the details must be given.

Rule 9—If the applicant is recommended by a Commission, the details must be given.

Rule 10—If the applicant is recommended by a District, the details must be given.
