My Lord Duke,

I have the honour to transmit herewith a Form of Particulars required for the computation of pension payable to Mr. Hugo Quiterie, 2nd Grade Clerk, Administration, who has been pronounced unfit for further service in this Colony by a medical board held on him at the Native Civil Hospital, Mombasa, on the 22nd March, 1923. A copy of the proceedings of this Board is enclosed for Your Grace's information.

1. Mr. Quiterie's services date from the 30th May, 1897, and he is, therefore, eligible for a pension in respect of sixteen completed years. The pension is computed at shs. 1,286.40 a year with effect from the 10th November, 1923, inclusive.

2. Pending the receipt of Your Grace's sanction to the pension recommended, I have authorized the payment to Mr. Quiterie of an alimentary allowance at the rate of Shs. 1,200/- a year with effect from the date quoted.

INSTRUCTIONS REFERRED TO ON PAGE 1.

12. This Paper of Representations and the Considerations connected with it, do not refer to pay-scale, the same must be duly attended.

13. Item 10.—If the case of an Officer comes under the West Form of Mysore statement to be addressed to a native of that State, Colonial Regulation 3/1907.

14. Item 11.—State the responsibility of Mysore for which the Applicant is recommended, viz., Superintendent compensation, Compensation allowances, or gratuity, and its amount. In the case of Pay varying or allowing an Officer to claim Pay in respect of Professional or other special qualifications, it should be stated and a reference should be given to the authority under which the claim is made.

15. Item 12.—In case of loss from ~~any~~ ~~any~~ by one or more banks, the usual "broken" should be also called up, giving the name of recovered amounts, and the cause, date, and circumstances of the loss, e.g., example, itself in cash under banking.

16. If the Paying authority has been incapable of giving history, or in that situation which he refers to the 12 months immediately before the date of his retirement, the actual annual rate of Salary or Fees at that date ought to be quoted, preceded by the word "average." In other cases where the annual average of salary or fees for the 12 months next preceding the date of retirement is required, preceded by the word "average," but if the whole period of service is less than 12 months, then the average for the whole period of service should be quoted.

17. Item 17.—If the average of the previous Annual Value, for the 12 months immediately preceding retirement, of such Remuneration (allowance of salary or wages) which is claimed to be paid in the consideration of the Pension or Gratuity.

If however the average of Room or House Allowance, so ascertained, exceeds, one-sixth of the average ~~allowance~~ ~~allowances~~ which must be Paid for Pension purposes, it is to be reduced to one-sixth of the ~~allowance~~ ~~allowances~~, as that it shall not exceed one-sixth of the whole.

18. Item 18.—If an officer is entitled to retain for his own use will be taken into account his personal pay with regular salary, an additional average of the net receipts of the 12 months immediately preceding the officer's retirement. These net receipts are to be ascertained by deducting the gross amount of Expenses (Office Expenses, etc., as an officer may have had to defray for his services, or performing the services for which he was remunerated by Fees, & gratuities, &c., except that the sum should be made in respect of Office Expenses provided for Public Funds for the last fortnight of those dates in which a Fixed Salary is annexed. Pay of "Pensioner" when forwarded to the Colonial Department should be accompanied by full particulars from the retiring Officer, showing the amount received by them for fees, and a statement addressed to the Secretary to the Government, in each of the three years immediately preceding the retirement. It will be the duty of the Colonial Government concerned to make allowances of the amount of such amounts before forwarding them to the Colonial Office. In the case of Officers receiving Fixed Salaries and Fees, the Fees will not in ordinary applications be allowed to count for Pension purposes to the extent of more than one quarter the Salaries and Fees will not in any case be allowed to count for Pension purposes during a period in which the whole sum of the officer retaining them was not given to the Public Service.

19. Item 19.—In case of retirement of an Officer to below the compulsory age for retirement, a Medical Certificate is to be forwarded certifying that he is disabled by infirmity of mind or body for discharging the duties of his estimation, and that such infirmity is likely to be permanent.

In case of the medical certificate or doctor this certificate should be signed by two Officers, witness at least one should, if possible, be a Resident Officer of the Government.

20. Item 20.—In "Retired" service see Item 5.

If the applicant has had any "acting" service, the details must be fully given, with statement whether or not, during the "acting" service, he was connected with the permanent staff service of the Colony.

21.—In quoted compensation, a professional Civil Officer has been allowed to have "private practice" without forfeiting his claim to Pension, the facts are to be fully stated.

22.—If the Applicant is liable to any deduction from his service under Clause 102 of the Colonial Regulations, the same should be fully stated.

23.—The length of service and other particulars of the compensation may be given. When an average of salary, &c., is taken, the mode of calculating it (whether by months, &c.) is to be explained.
