1. The number of years and months completed with the service should be stated in the order of their occurrence.

2. In the case of an Officer serving on the first class, the service, a statement is to be made of the number of years and months of that class. (Colonial Regulations, 1864)

3. In the case of an Officer, for which the Applicant is not entitled, viz. Superannuation Allowance, or Gratuity, and by amount. In the case of an Officer, a statement is to be made in respect of Professional and other special qualifications, and a reference should be given to the regulation under which the claim is made.

4. If the service has been interrupted by one or more breaks, the word "broken" should be used, and the number of years and months, and the exact dates, and circumstances of each break should be stated under heading 2.

5. If an Officer has not been in receipt of the same salary, or in the class, for the 36 months immediately before the date of his retirement, the actual amount, rate of Salary or Wages, at that date should be inserted, preceded by the word "actual". In other cases, the average amount of Salary or Wages for the 36 months next preceding the date of retirement should be inserted, preceded by the word "average," but if the whole period of service exceeds three years, then the average for the whole period of service should be inserted.

6. A separate statement should be inserted of the average Annual Value, for the 36 months immediately preceding retirement, of each Emolument (exclusive of salary or wages) which is claimed to be included in the calculation of the Pension or Gratuity.

7. Whenever the value of a House or House Allowance, so far as it exceeds one-sixth of the salary and other emoluments which would be received for Pension purposes, it is to be reduced to one-sixth of that amount, so that it shall not exceed one-seventh of the whole.

8. The net amount which an Officer is allowed to retain for his own use will be taken into account for Pension purposes, with regular salary, at the monthly rate of the net receipts of the 36 months next preceding the Officer's retirement. These net receipts are to be ascertained by deducting from the gross amount of Fees, &c., which he has received as an Officer, any amount he has had to deduct for his own expenses, in performance of the service in which he was remunerated by Fees, &c., and also from the gross amount of the net receipts of the 36 months next preceding the date of his retirement, the amount of any Public Funds to which he is entitled, and which are annexed to his Office, &c., and also the amount of any other emoluments which he is entitled to receive, and which are not included in the above-mentioned net receipts. 
