I should be pleased to have your comments on, or your concurrence in the following:-

The formal Agreement signed by Mr. Mapp is similar to that in the file of Miss Weld, File 2360. In this case the agreement was signed a week after the engagement. It states the protested that she had reason to leave privileges which were taken away. In this agreement, the Governor had to climb a tree to grant leave. The Honourable The Colonial Secretary,

I have the honour to submit the case of the Staff, - European and Asiatic - employed in this Department, who are unprovided for in the way of leave or any of the privileges that are usually attached to Government Service, and I would request that their case be represented to the Secretary of State for the Colonies for the favourable consideration of the Army Council.

The following Members of my Staff were employed on the Staff of the Chief Paymaster, R.A.P.C., as Non-Commissioned Officers and took their discharge and continued to serve as Civilian Accountants and Clerks:

Mr. CRAIG,

Mr. MORRISON,

Mr. SAUVAGE

and they are by virtue of their Military Service entitled on release to a return passage to England or South Africa. The remaining Members of my Staff, who were locally engaged by me on taking up my appointment as Officer in Charge, King's African Rifles Clearance Section, on April, 1921, are,

Mr. MELLIS,

Mr. TOWNSIE,

Mr. TRENTHAM,

Mrs. S. H. TOWNSEND, Clerk

and the Assistant

I do not share in that concession.

All the Members of my Staff are on a temporary basis, subject to termination without notice. 612 of them have now accepted permanent contracts. Dr. Gove had leave. Apart from leaving him half pay until his identification included in the former contract, I consider it appropriate to establish a two-months' notice period for such transfers. In view of the emergency & the work undertaken, and my desire to specially thank the War Department for its care,

It has by right of duty that the rates of compensation owing to the temporary administrative staff of which the accompanying Staff are part, are considerably higher than those at present prevailing locally, but as these amounts were specifically selected by the individual who possessed experience or the kind of work to be undertaken, I do not consider that the rates they offer are derived from sufficient reason to debar them from leave privileges.

I estimate that approximately three months will be required for a reasonable period.

I furthermore desire to recommend that the Administrative Staff be granted full rights over the same as may be favourably considered for other staff, i.e., 30 days leave conditions, separate time apart from the compulsory Government service.
