A BILL  
INTITLED  
AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND THE DIVORCE ORDINANCE

ENACTED by the Governor of the Colony of Sierra Leone  
with the advice and consent of the Council  
thereof:-

1. This Ordinance may be cited as "The Divorce  
(Amendment) Ordinance, 1923," and shall be read as one  
with "The Divorce Ordinance, 1911," hereinafter  
referred to as "the Principal Ordinance."

2. Section 2 of the Principal Ordinance is hereby  
repealed and the following Section is substituted  
therefor:-

"2. Nothing hereinafter contained shall authorize:-

- (1) the making of any decree of dissolution of marriage unless the petitioner is domiciled in the Colony or Protectorate at the time when the petition is presented;
- (2) the making of any decree of nullity of marriage, unless the petitioner is resident in the Colony or Protectorate at the time when the petition is presented, or unless the marriage was solemnised in the Colony or Protectorate."

3. Section 3 of the Principal Ordinance is hereby amended as follows:-

- (a) By the deletion of the definition of "Africa";
- (b) By the insertion of the following definition:-

"marriage"

"marriage" means the union of one man  
and one woman for life to the exclusion of  
all others. Provided, that such union  
be dissolved in accordance with the  
provisions of this Ordinance.

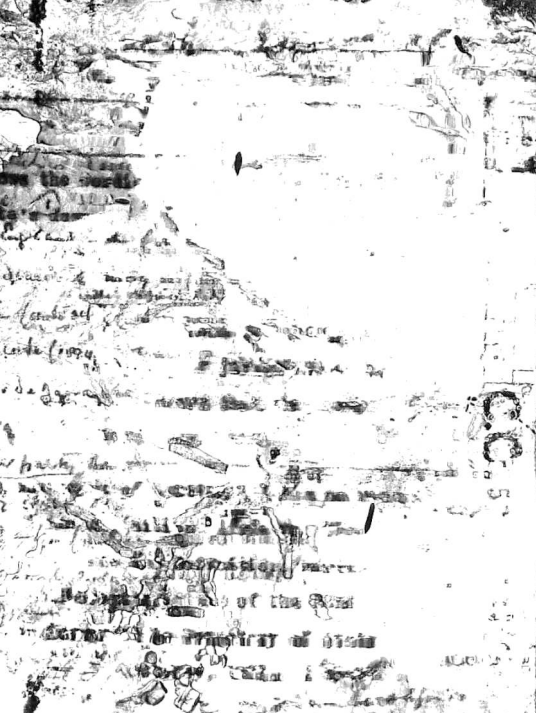

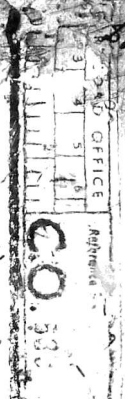

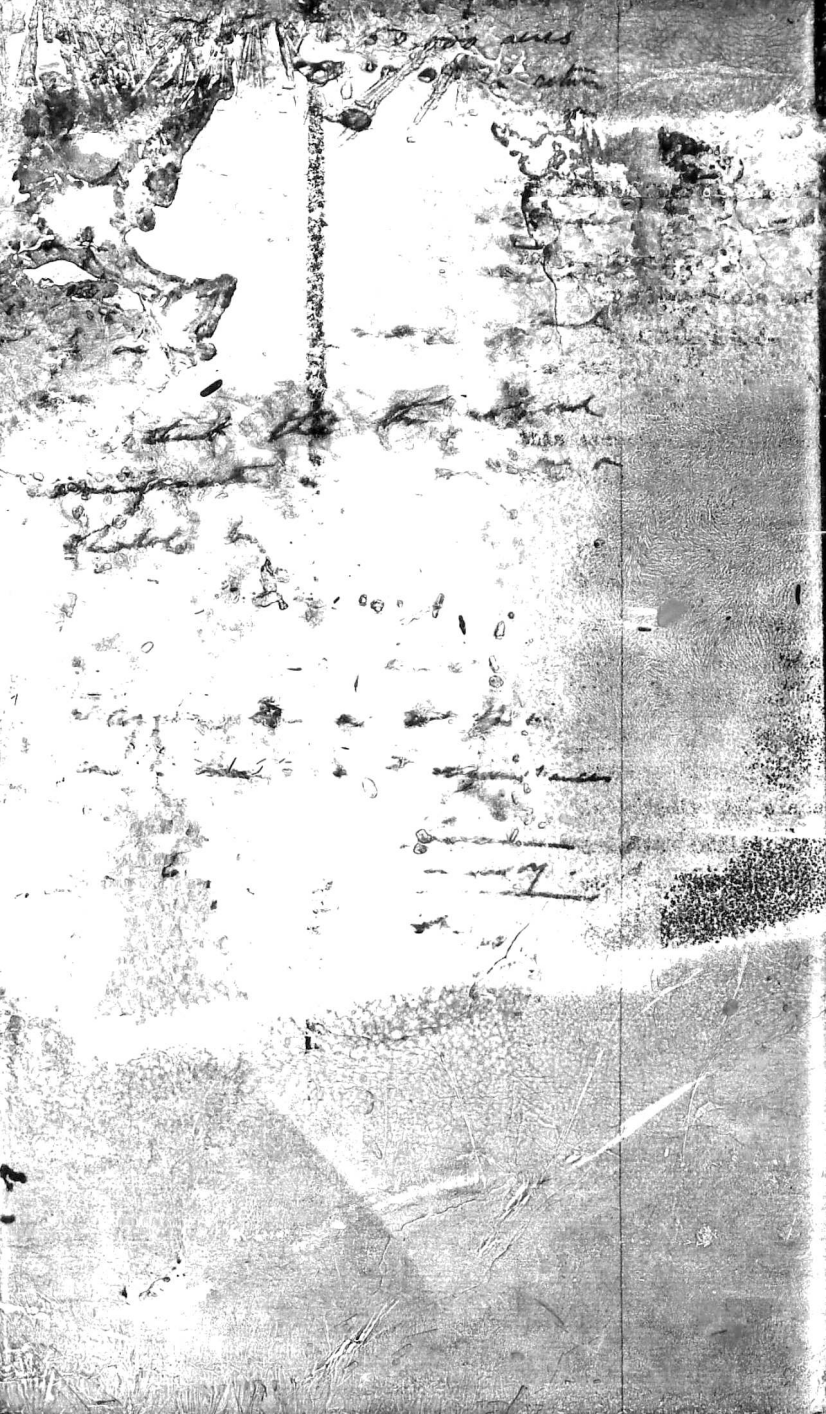
