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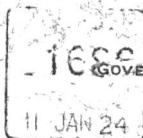

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My Lord Duke,

I have the honour to transmit a Form of Particulars required to be furnished for the computation of Pension payable to Mr. Sami Ullah, First Grade Clerk, Post and Telegraph Department, who has been invalidated out of service by a Medical Board held on him at the Native Civil Hospital, Nairobi, on the 23rd day of May, 1923. A copy of the proceedings of this Medical Board is enclosed for Your Grace's information.

2. Mr. Sami Ullah's service dates from the 18th of February, 1902, and he is, therefore, eligible for a pension of Shs:2696/40a year in respect of his 21 completed years of service, with effect from the 6th of October, 1923.

3. Pending the receipt of Your Grace's sanction to the amount recommended, I have authorized the payment of an Alimentary Allowance to Mr. Sami Ullah at the rate of Shs:2040/- a year with effect from the date his pension is due.

INSTRUCTIONS REFERRED TO ON PAGE 1.

If this Paper of Particulars and the Certificates connected with it, be not sent in original, the copies must be duly attested.

1. If the Officer is serving on the West Coast of Africa, a statement is to be added of the rate of his Salary on that Coast. (Colonial Regulations, § 430).
2. A statement is to be given of all wages for which the Applicant is recommended, viz., Superannuation, Gratuity, or other allowances, and its amount. In the case of Personal Services, the Applicant is to state in respect of Professional or other special qualifications, the rate of salary or wages to be given to the authority under which the claim is made.
3. If the Applicant has been interrupted by leave or non-breaks, the word "broken" should be added to the number of years and months, and the causes, dates, and circumstances of the non-breaks or breaks should be stated under heading 2.
4. If the Person retiring has been in receipt of the same Salary, or in the class from which he retires, for the 36 months immediately before the date of his retirement, the actual annual rate of Salary or Wages at that date should be inserted, preceded by the word "actual." In other cases the average annual amount of Salary or Wages for the 36 months next preceding the date of retirement should be inserted, preceded by the word "average," but if the whole period of service is less than three years, then the average for the whole period of service should be inserted.
5. A separate statement is to be given of the average Annual Value, for the 36 months immediately preceding retirement, of each Emolument (exclusive of salary or wages) which is claimed to be included in the computation of the Pension or Gratuity.
- When the value of such Emolument, as ascertained, exceeds one-sixth of the salary or other emolument which is to be counted for Pension purposes, it is to be reduced to one-sixth of that amount, so that it shall not exceed one-seventh of the whole.
- Fees which an Officer is allowed to retain for his own use will be taken into account for Pension purposes, with regular salary, at the annual average of the net receipts of the 36 months next preceding the Officer's retirement. These net receipts are to be ascertained by deducting from the gross amount of Fees such Office Expenses, &c., as an Officer may have had to defray from his own resources in performing the services for which he was remunerated by Fees. No portion of wages taken from the Fees should be made in respect of Office Expenses provided from the Public Service for the due discharge of his duties to which a Fixed Salary is annexed. Papers of this nature, when forwarded to the Colonial Department should be accompanied by formal statements showing the retiring Officers allowing the amount received by them for fees, and the deductions made therefor for Office Expenses, &c., in each of the three years immediately preceding retirement. It will be the duty of the Colonial Government concerned to satisfy themselves of the accuracy of such statements before forwarding them to the Colonial Office. In the case of Officers receiving Fixed Salaries and Fees, the Fees will not in ordinary circumstances be allowed to count for Pension purposes to the extent of more than one quarter of the Salary, and fees will not in any case be allowed to count for Pension purposes during non-employment, in the whole term of the Officer receiving them, was not given to the Public Service.

The Board having assembled proceed to examine Mr. Sami Ulich.

22 years in East Africa, 14 of which spent in Kenya. Previously suffered from "Osteo cartilage" of knee joint. - in trouble from this age.

Complaints:- States he does not sleep - suffers from attacks of severe headache and pains in the back, he suffers from indigestion and is unable to concentrate on his work, he frequently is constipated.

Condition:- is not anemic - appears to be well nourished, heart - not enlarged - weakness of 1st sound - pulse 12.

Lungs normal; spleen and liver not enlarged, throat - congestion of tonsils.

Since the last report he has been under observation and treatment by V. Sargent, he had a bad attack of Lushes on 24/4/23, on 28/4/23 and on 12/4/23 had attacks of fever, Temperature did not exceed 101.2. The blood was negative for malarial parasites, since 7/5/23 he has been suffering from pharyngitis and slight cellulitis, his headache has become worse and necessitated the use of an abdominal belt, he has not improved since the last report.

The Board recommends that Mr. Sami Ulich be invalided out of the
