My Lord Luke,

I have the honour to bring to Your Grace's notice the conditions which have hitherto governed the grant of leave to school-masters and members of the school staff in this Colony. The school terms usually average 39 weeks in the year, the remaining 13 weeks represent holiday periods.

2. As school-masters have enjoyed the same privileges in respect of leave as all other Government officers, it follows that a school-master after 2½ years' resident service in the Colony of which period he will have spent probably 6 months on vacation has been entitled to 6 months in Europe exclusive of 1 month allowed for the voyage - that is to say that in respect of 47 months he will have actually worked 32 months, spent 8 months on leave in the Colony and 7 months on leave in Europe or out of the Colony.

The Government secondary schools in this Colony are situated in healthy localities - Mombasa, Malindi and Eldoret - the school hours are 8.30 to 1.30, except on Saturdays which is a day of abstinence.

3. The Select Committee have recommended that the period of school holidays should not count

as resident service in the case of school-masters and school staff and that savings would be thereby effected on the following votes on the Education Department:

4. The Director of Education agreed and I entirely concur in these recommendations. I see no grounds for allowing school-masters to take leave to Europe after 30 months' service, of which 6 months have been spent in holidays locally. Further, the interference with school studies has been very considerable and the Colony has been obliged to meet expense in payment of substitutes.

5. I also propose that school-masters shall be required to take their leave as far as possible at the commencement of one of the three periods of school holidays and to return to the Colony for the commencement of a school term.

6. Subject to Your Grace's covering approval, I have accepted the recommendation of the Select Committee and leave regulations for the teaching staff in the Education Department will be drafted accordingly.
