In continuation of the above mentioned I enclose statements showing the present state of affairs as regards the auditing of Government in Nairobi and Mombasa.

1. Unless these statements will show the work is in arrears and will continue to be so until I obtain sufficient staff is done with it am of opinion that all Revenue earning departments should be regularly inspected.

2. With the exception of the Head Office departments have been visited for five or six months without a special request from the Head of Department for an audit prior to the departure on leave or retirement of certain officers in the department concerned you will agree is not satisfactory.

3. The question of cutwater inspections and the proposed prior examination of the Public Works Department accounts has been fully dealt with in my letter no. 1174 mentioned above.

and if the correspondence increases greatly an additional clerk
might be necessary. This staff would enable us to examine all
accounts regularly in a comprehensive manner.

As you are aware the District Treasury, Mombasa is now quite self contained and so it would be possible to examine all expenditure accounts here instead of having them sent to Nairobi, and I provided for this in the 1924 Estimates and it would tend to efficiency and give general satisfaction if we could arrange to maintain an experienced Assistant Auditor here, as the inspection of the more distant Coast Stations necessitated a prolonged safari, it might be necessary to send a relief Assistant Auditor down here occasionally as if we were doing all the accounts here, the office could not be left too long, but I think I provided in the Estimates for an European Examiner of accounts to be located here also and if that could be arranged it might be possible to dispense with the relief Assistant Auditor.

6. The following are the Coast stations to be inspected and the dates of the last two inspections. The inspection carried out in 1922 of Lamu, Kilifi and Malindi was done by the Assistant Auditor, Zanzibar, as there was no one available in this Colony and the procedure was strongly resented by the Zanzibar Government, who pay for the full time of that Officer.
