These particular contributors have not been registered by us. Presumably the Government did not send us particulars concerning them because the question of their eligibility was under consideration. There would thus be no difficulty from the point of view of our records and accounts, since we should simply not register them, but even if they had been registered, there would be no difficulty.

If you propose to approve the refunds and make these officers' exclusion from the Scheme retrospective in the case of Nyasaland, we assume that you will communicate your decision to the other East African Governments also. When so doing perhaps you could instruct them to furnish us with lists of the contributors affected and the amounts of the refunds to be made to them, similar to the list furnished by Nyasaland, of which we have taken a copy, so that in the cases of contributors who have been registered by us, the necessary entries in our books may be made.

My Lord Duke,

With reference to paragraph 4 of Your Grace's despatch No. 393 of 6th December, I have the honour to submit the question of refund of contributions paid by temporary officers to the Widows and Orphans fund. A list of such officers shewing the amounts paid is attached.

2. As provision will be made in future for excluding such officers from the scheme, the Treasurer recommends that the contributions of the officers named on the attached list should be refunded to them, but before giving my approval I should be glad to know whether this measure meets with Your Grace's approval, and whether such refunds could be made without unduly confusing or complicating the records of the Fund kept by the Treasurers.

3. It is of course possible that some of the officers in question will eventually be placed on the permanent staff on probation, and that their probationary period may be held to commence from the date on which their temporary employment began. Decision in some at least of these cases will however not be made for some time, and you may think it preferable to regularise their position in the meantime by refunding the contributions already paid.

4. I shall be glad if the decision may be communicated to me by telegram.
