(1) The arrangements made when the British Indian Delegation were invited to come to London was that the subsistence allowance of 25/- a week should be paid to delegates from the date of arrival in England until the departure of the first direct steamer for S. of Africa. The discussions were concluded.

A Union Castle steamer is due to leave for Mombasa on the 7th of August, & in these circumstances are being sent to the C.A. for their consideration the requirement of the allowance after the 8th of August or from such date (as may be decided) as the delegates may leave for Africa.

(2) As regards passage to Mombasa, it is thought more convenient that delegates should make their own arrangements for the passage by whatever means they may prefer.
