I am directed by the Duke of Devonshire
to request you to inform the Lord Comptroller of the
Treasury that in the course of last year the
Govt. of Kenya, on grounds of economy, found it
necessary to refreshen a number of offices with short
service. Efforts have been made to find employment
for some of these officers in other Colonies and
Protectorates, and it is in regard to two of them,
viz., Mr. R. L. Webber and Dr. N. B. Peacock,
who have been appointed to Uganda that the
Secretary of State desires to approach the Lord Comptroller.

2. Mr. Webber was appointed an Admin.
Officer in Kenya on the 19th of June, 1921 and
the date aboveност his app't terminated on the
24th of October, 1922. His app't to Uganda

3. Dr. N. B. Peacock was appointed a

Officer in Uganda, on the 1st of August, 1923.
