MINUTES

I have done my best with this telegram, but the first dozen words (at least) are very defective (1) even if on despatch of 14 Dec. have reached the Govt, it is not conceivable that a general election is to be held about the known problem. No Colonial Government would so jeopardize his Government's passage allowance.

Therefore, for 'about' read 'without'.
(2) The Legislative Council Ordⁿ 1919 provides for elections at regular intervals of three years after the first. The first poll was on 25th March 1920, so that another election will
