3. Mr. Shamsad-Deen has withdrawn. I understand, from Major Dutton: he found himself, I believe, too moderate for his supporters!
4. According to our provisional programme the Secretary of State for the Colonies will receive this deputation.

We have not contemplated Lord Peel receiving them at any rate at the preliminary stage. <sup>Possibly</sup> ~~possibly~~ however <sup>as a</sup> result of yesterday's meetings, ~~within~~ the Europeans and Indians from Kenya are to be received together <sup>in formal session</sup> (after the Secretary of State has received the Indians alone) ~~on formal occasion~~. Lord Peel may be expected to be present <sup>at the joint formal meeting</sup> ~~on that occasion~~.

This can wait <sup>to the moment</sup> ~~for the moment~~ but I think we should try to get a day and time fixed for the Secretary of State to receive the Kenya Indians on or after (say) 4th May: we do not want to waste time, but if they arrive 1st May I suppose they must have a day or two to themselves first: ~~on Monday 1st May~~ ~~on Tuesday 2nd May~~ ~~on Wednesday 3rd May~~

If Secretary of State can fix a time we can let Mr. Varma know at once and he can inform the others when they arrive. Sir R. Coryndon who was here this morning says that Desai who is the leader of the Indian delegation, is really a paid agitator and has no stake or personal interest in Kenya.




