I am instructed by the Board of Directors of this Company formally to protest against the proposed demolition of the Voi-Taveta kailway. As no doubt you are aware, this Company has taken up an area of 100,000 acres in the Taveta District under the terms of Lease dated 31st ay; 1915, and it was in view of the existence of this Railway that such area was applied for by our late Managing Director, the late General Sir Owen Thomas, M.P.

If the authorities decide to carry out their professed intention of destroying the Railway, this Company must consider the question of compensation for any loss in value to the Concession which may result as a consequence.

A formal protest has also been made to the Kenya overnment.
