no It appears that the English Sanitary Inspectors holding office in British East Agrica are practically all selected in England and possess the Sanitary Inspectors Certificate and some now also hold the Institute Certificate in Tropical Hygiens.

The native Inspectors are not at present equal to examinations on the English Standard, but a Medical School has just been started in the Uganda with Dr. H. B. Owen as Medical Tutor, and it is under contemplation to start a School in Dar-es-Salaam and possibly also in Zanzibar, where the training of native Inspectors may be undertaken.

Uso far as the Examinations are concerned, it is suggested that in the first instance after a period of training, local examinations similar to those held in the West Indies might be established, and that subsequently for candidates successful at the preliminary local examinations, the standard Examinations of the Institute might be arranged, a joint Board being formed to include Tanganyika Territory, Uganda, Kenya and Zanzibar.
