I. PUR POSE:

The Education Commission to East Africa is the result of the co-operative relationship of the Phelpe-Stokes Fund, the International Educational Board, the Covernments concerned in Africa and missionary societies of Europe and America. The purposes of the Commission are the same as those of the Commission to West, South and Equatorial Africa in 1920-21. These purposes are as follows:-

- To enquire as to the educational work being done at present ineach of the areas to be studied;
- (2) To investigate the educational needs of the people in the light of the religious, social, hygienic and economic conditions;
