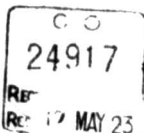

I should be greatly obliged if you would inform me whether His Grace has yet decided to afford me and my colleagues an opportunity of meeting the Indian delegations in the presence of himself and the Secretary of State for India.

I feel it incumbent upon me to reiterate that we consider it of the greatest importance that we should obtain a clear statement of their case from the Indian delegations. We have seen certain claims put forward in the Press, which confirm us in our view, that it is essential that such statement should be <sup>a</sup> preliminary to any further discussion.

I trust His Grace will see his way to appointing an early date for the desired Conference.

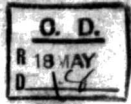
