I have the honour to acknowledge the receipt of Your Lordship's Circular despatches dated 23rd January and 10th February regarding the forthcoming Imperial Forestry Conference, and to enclose a memorandum as asked for by the Forest Commissioners and prepared by Mr. Battiscombe.

2. I should be grateful if the 150 copies of the memorandum to which the Forest Ordinances in Appendix B. should be appended may be printed in England in time for the Conference.
