Sir,

I understand the Government are desirous to award to officers who have served in this war and are desirous of settling in East Africa, I beg to apply for a grant of land on the side of the Jumi River, Col. A. Mchuna, R.A.M.C. and myself on the Jumi River side of the river and on the side farthest from the border. We would ask for 10,000 acres each and the water rights from the Jumi River for water for our farms, as this is an uninhabited region and much of it is covered with bush which would cost to clear infinitely more than the ground is worth and the ground is only good for cattle with some patches that could be cultivated if water was pumped up from the river.

Our service in E. Africa is as under:-

- Major A. Myburgh, 3 Reg. Hussars, Staff Captain R.A.M.H. 1914 on General Staff B.E.A. Ex-Force 1916.
- Lt. Col. Mchuna, O.C. 15 Stationary Hospital, Mbyuni 1916, also at Moresoro G.E.A. 1917.

The reason we are asking for a grant of land in this district is that we know it is fairly healthy and will do for cattle. It is an uninhabited region and there is no demand for it. Land to be given out is too remote for men who are no longer young.

We would be willing to pay the cost of survey and if the Colonial Office would cable out instructions to the Government Surveyor and point out what we would like to see done.

I myself am invalided out of the service from disabilities contracted on active service. Lt. Col. A. Mchuna is leaving the service if he obtains this grant.
