237 May 4th your telegram 21st April alien missionaries following in Protectorate licensed to remain at places named under former enemy alien restriction ordinance 23 of 1919 Brother Godfrey Leykauf White Fathers Mombasa, Brothers Martial Meierand Killian Betting Saint Asaph Roman Catholic Mission Kyambat under no restrictions otherwise. No nuns. Application from Roman Catholic ~~nuns~~ about to be deported from German East Africa to enter and reside in East Africa Protectorate refused. Alsation missionaries Schwegeler and Weigel interned India refused permission to return to East Africa Protectorate owing to their active participation in enemy side during war.
