My Lord,

I have the honour to acknowledge the receipt of Your Lordship's despatch No. 501 of the 8th April, regarding the non-payment of War Bonus to Mrs. Hagenson, a temporary clerk in the Registration of Documents Department, and to inform Your Lordship of the circumstances attending this lady's engagement and payment.

2. Mrs. Hagenson was engaged for temporary employment on 1st January 1919 at a consolidated salary of Rs:200/- per month, which was provided for by Special Warrant, as there was no vacancy for an additional clerk in the sanctioned Estimates.

3. As the rate of pay at which Mrs. Hagenson was engaged was very much higher than the rate ruling prior to January 1916, on which rate the War Bonus was calculated and paid, the Treasurer was of opinion that Mrs. Hagenson was not entitled to War Bonus. It is clear that the consolidated salary paid was intended to cover War Bonus.

4. In the circumstances I regret that no payment is due to this lady.
