Mr Cooke has raised the question of the salary in
Wynand. We have just got Treasury sanction for
£400-500-£500 for the Wynand vacancy, but the
Wynand posts to be filled are according to the
estimates two temporary non-permanent ones at
£400. We have just reappointed Mr. A. T. Fleet
to one of these at £600, & I suppose we must get
Treasury to agree to the £400-500-£500 scales for
these posts. I think we must do so, & when they
agree tell Gov. to put Mr. Fleet on permanent
scale. Meanwhile I think we may assume the
approval in writing to candidates, as the first
increment will in any case not be due till after
next year estimates.
