My Lord,

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I have the honour to forward herewith a form of particulars required for the computation of a pension to Mr. H.K. Math, a 3rd Grade Clerk in the Treasury, who has been pronounced unfit for further service in this protectorate by a Medical Board held on him in India.

2. Mr. H.K. Math's service dates from December 1906 and he is eligible, therefore, for a pension in respect of 13 completed years. This pension is proposed at £26.17-4 per annum with effect from 13th April 1920.

3. Although the report of the Medical Board which qualified this official is dated 7th June, I would recommend that the pension be anticipated to 13th April so as to cover the period of leave without pay. This is in accordance with the precedent approved by your Lordship in despatch No. 429 of the 20th May 1916.

Pending the receipt of Your
Lordship's sanction of the grant of this
pension, I have authorised the issue of
an alimentary allowance to Mr. Shah at 489
the rate of £24 per annum and trust
Your Lordship will approve my action.

If this Paper or Particulars and the Certificates connected with it, be not sent in original, the copies must be duly attested.

Head 1.— In the case of an Officer serving on the West Coast of Africa, a statement is to be made whether he is a native of that Coast. (Colonial Regulations, § 40).

Head 2.— State the description of Allowance for which the Applicant is recommended, viz. Superannuation Compensation, Allowances of Gratuity, and its amount. In the case of claiming gratuity in respect of Professional or other special qualifications, such should be stated, and reference should be given to the authority under which the claim is made.

Head 3.— If the service has been interrupted by one or more breaks, the word "broken" should be before or after the number of years and months, and the causes, dates, and circumstances of break or breaks should be stated under heading 9.

Head 4.— If the Applicant has been in receipt of the same Salary, or in the class from which he retires, for the 36 months immediately before the date of his retirement, the actual amount of Salary or Wages and date should be inserted, preceded by the word "annual". If less than the number of annual amount of Salary or Wages for the 36 months previous to the retirement shall be inserted, preceded by the word "average". If the service has been broken into two or three years, then the average for the whole period.

Head 5.— State the salary received by the Applicant for the average period previous to retirement, and the amounts paid him during the same period.

In the case of more than one service, this Certificate should be signed by two Officers, and if possible, by a Salaried Officer of the Government.

Head 6.— Is the Applicant in "broken" service see Head 5.

If the Applicant has had any "acting" service, the details may be fully given with a statement whether or not, during the "acting" service, he was connected with the permanent Civil Service of the Colony.

Head 7.— If, in special circumstances, a professional Civil Officer has been allowed to have private means without forfeiting his claimed pension, the facts are to be fully stated.

Head 8.— If the Applicant is liable to any deduction from his service under Article 10 of the Colonial Regulations, the facts should be fully stated.

Head 9.— The length of service and other particulars of the compensation due to be written. When an average salary is taken, the mode of calculating it will be clearly set out in the witness.
