My Lord,

In connection with the work of the Local Clearing Office, I have the honour to request that a ruling may be given on the subject of the status of individuals who at the outbreak of war were enemy subjects and now claim to be nationals of one of the group of states previously forming part of the Enemy Empires and now separated, and recognised as friendly to the Allied Governments.

2. This question has arisen locally in the case of Mr. C. Schwentafsky, on the subject of whose property in Mombasa Sir Henry Belstead addressed a despatch No. 478 to Mr. Bonar Law on August 4th, 1916, whose nationality was Austrian before and during the time of hostilities and who is now seeking to prove his nationality as a Pole.

3. In the course of their succeeding in such proof, the controllers of the Local Clearing Office are at a loss as to how to treat his property and
