408 16th August your despatch 19th June
indicated credits received on parcels from
United Kingdom and Italy entirely inadequate to
cover cost of handling and transport in this colony.
A small fee was imposed as a simple immediate
means of meeting loss. A fee of 25 centimes would
contribute substantially towards costs and
would scarcely be worth imposing. In view of
colonial position of colony unable to recommend
abolition or reduction of present fee unless United
Kingdom prepared to revise its current rates
in this colony so as to allow of reduction in its
rates to it and so bring them in line with those
levied from other overseas colonies. As quoted
foreign parcels come from United Kingdom -
the credits would approximately suffice loss of
loss arising abolition clearance fee and establish
a working basis. Parcels sent with Italy
possible but to avoid any question of specially
favoured treatment recommend reduction of present
fee on Italian parcels also pending general
agent clearance fee question.
