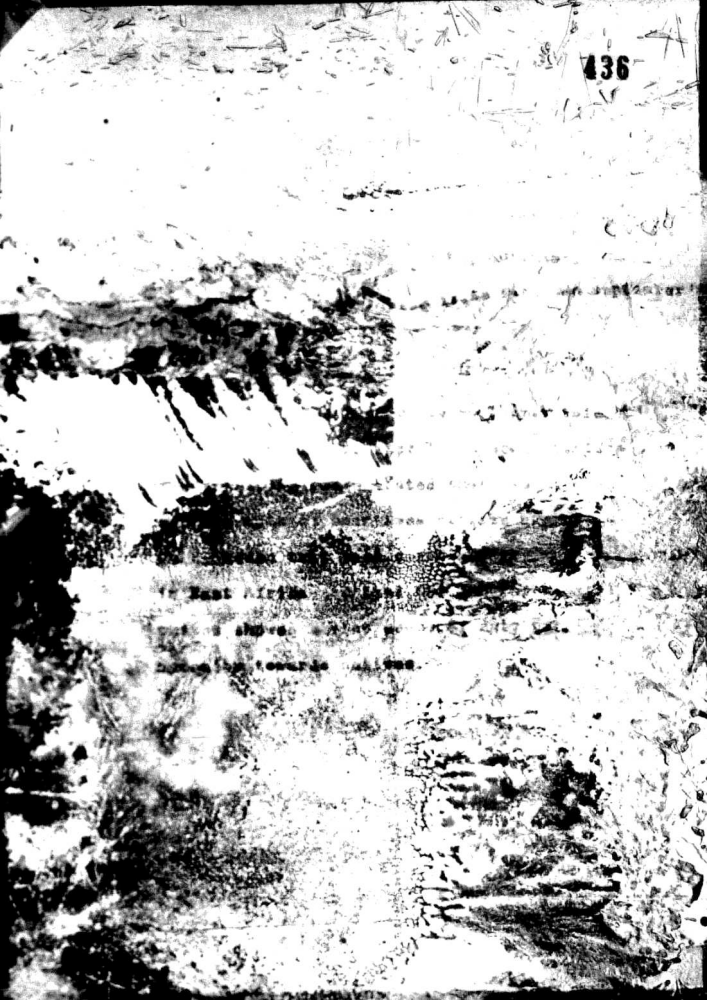

After the adult stage has been reached some females are capable of laying any young hatchlings. The period between hatching and the total length of life varies greatly - from 90 to 300 days. The male is unknown.

In the adult stage, the green scale is to the naked eye, of a lemon green colour. The shape is a flat oval, but those along the sides of veins show a slight twist to right or left and have the front end more or less sharpened.

Under a lens, the eyes are seen as conspicuous black spots near the margins.

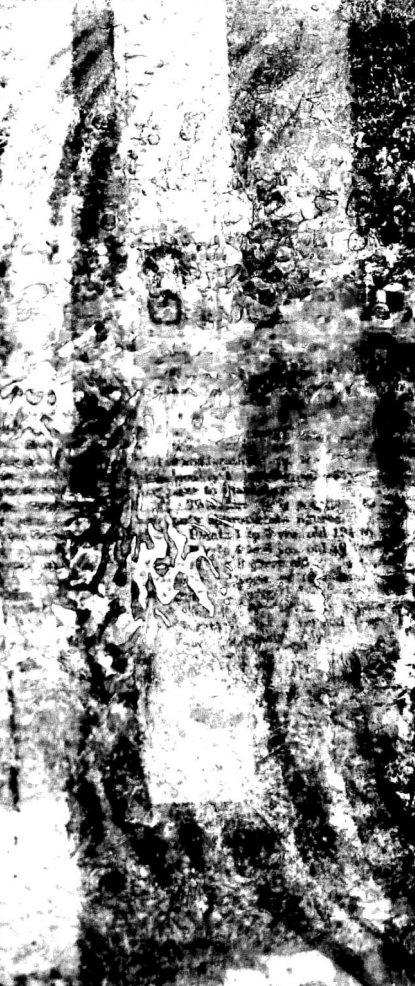

These experiments, as you will have noticed, deal with the direct effect of the ants on the development of green scale. He does not appear to have carried out any experiments to decide whether ants play a part in the spread of the pest.

In Mysore, experiments were carried out by Coleman and his states that—

There can be no doubt that those species of ants which feed on the honey dew have a large share in the distribution of the pest.

Outing trees and pruning out the worst infested trees does not seem to have given much satisfaction.

The movement of workers among the plants and their handling during these operations could not be done without the constant danger of young bugs getting on to the boys and thus being carried to uninfected parts of the plantation.

The spraying or washing of the plants in the infested patches and the destruction of the ants have proved the most effective control methods.

Spraying to Control Green Scale.

When the infested patches have been located, they should be marked conspicuously with long poles or bamboos. When this is not done there is often difficulty in finding the patches again.

The two most important considerations in spraying are—

1. That the spray should reach all the insects.
2. That the insects should be killed.

Brushing.

Brushing infested plants if it is well done, is even more effective than spraying.

It is done by using a brush made of broomsticks or similar material, and dipping it in a solution of kerosene or creosote.

As a general rule, a considerable amount of light or dry weather should be present when the bushes are being brushed.

The brush should be kept in a bucket of kerosene or creosote, and the insects should be killed by the fumes.

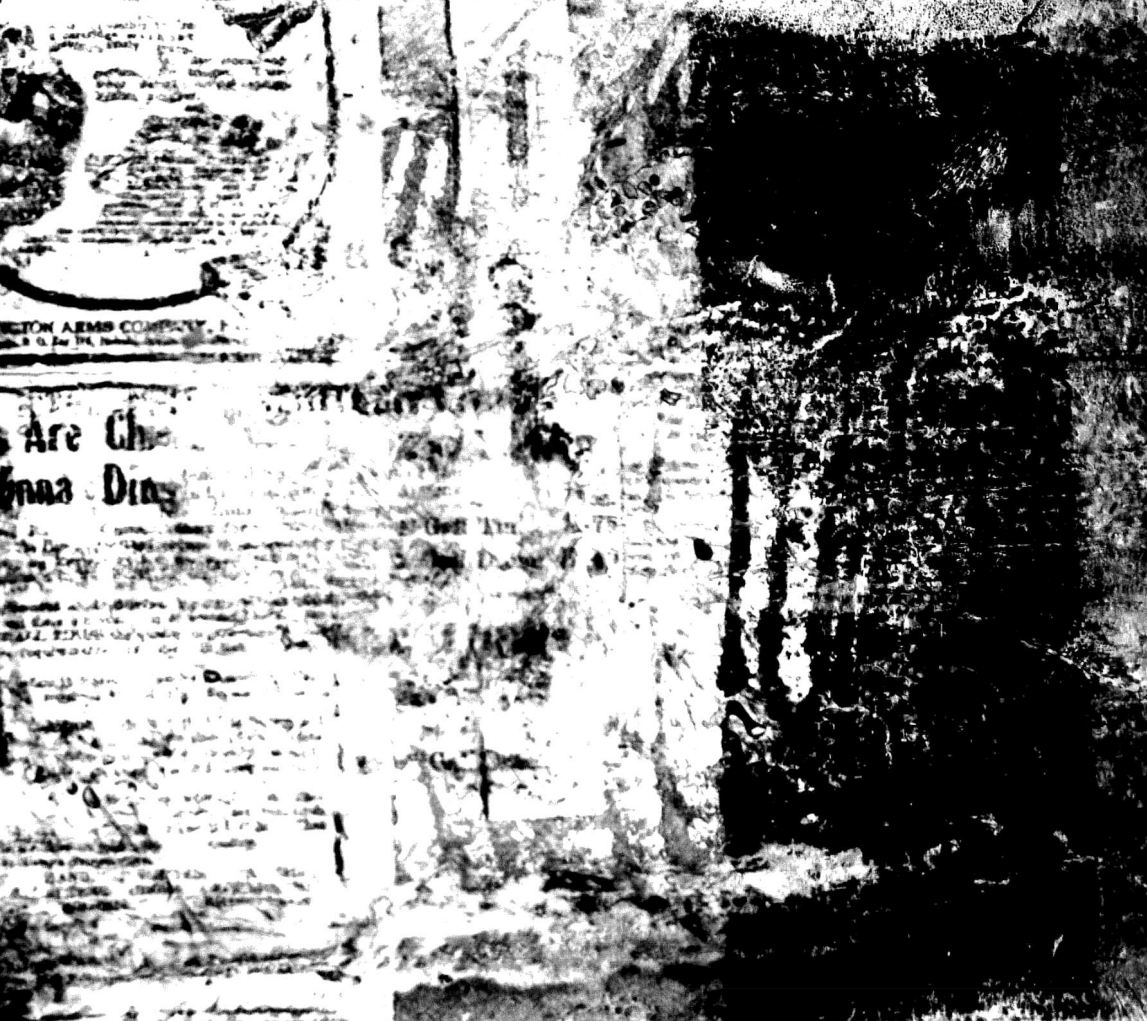

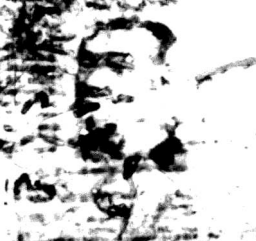

English Cars.

The Hon. Secretary of the R.E.C.A.A. tells me that a rather curious comparison was made, regarding the besting of English cars in East Africa.

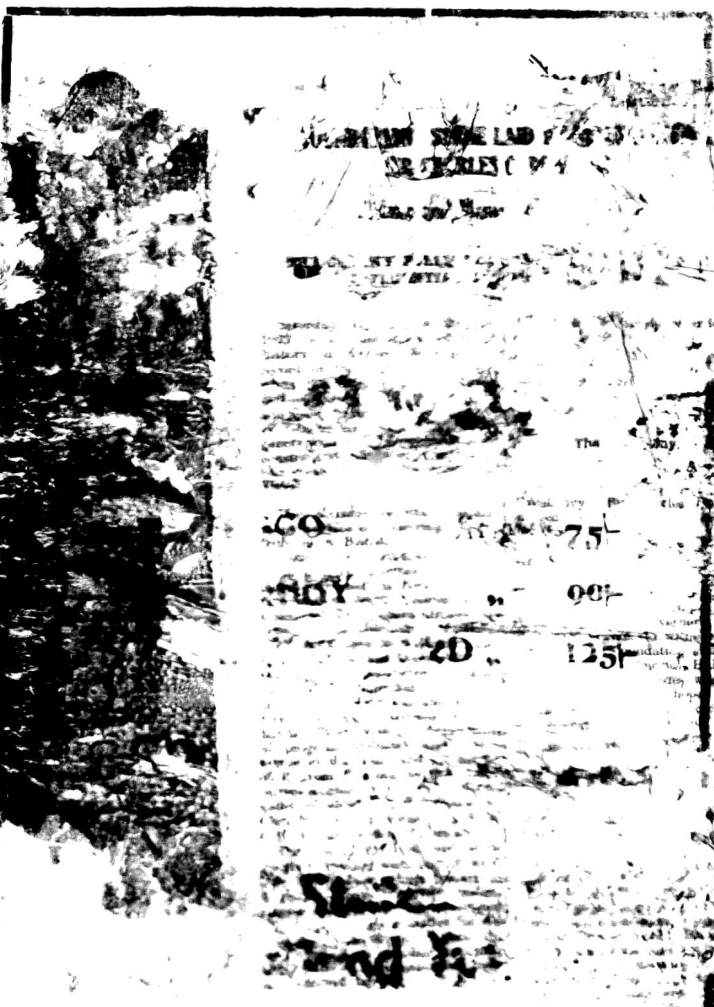

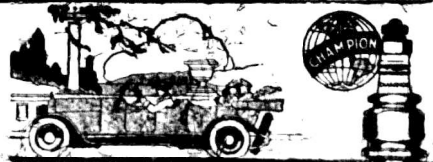

About Flour Milling

In view of certain statements which are being made we think necessary to publish a few solid facts.
The sale of local flour is rapidly increasing and is now sufficient to absorb all the wheat grown in the country. In the last 12 months our sales alone have more than quadrupled, yet our mill is not selling more than one-third of its capacity.
The quantity of wheat flour imported in the last six months ended March 31st, 1924, was 11,335 bags value £10,500, less than in any previous six months during the current six months.
It will be seen that the country, not on the water or in the air but actually over-milling, have a combined capacity of 20,000 tons of flour per month. The wheat harvested this year is likely to be sufficient to supply the country's requirements for flour for the next 12 months.
