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My Lord,

With reference to Your Lordship's telegram of July 17th, ^{last year} I have the honour to inform Your Lordship that the relaxation of the rule debarring European Officers from holding pecuniary interests in the Colony has met with great appreciation from the service. I am confident that that concession has been the means not only of giving officers a more lively interest in the possibilities of the country but of broadening their outlook in the exercise of their official duties.

2. I am satisfied that no cases of abuse have as yet occurred, and while I consider that it is still necessary to maintain careful supervision over the transactions and investments made by officers, I trust that the concession may be continued as a permanent arrangement.

3. I have the honour to enclose herewith, in accordance with Your Lordship's instructions, a full

statement of all applications from officers under this ruling giving all particulars of the different cases.

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4. The return is incomplete in the case of certain officers who are on leave, and whose applications were approved before all details of the purchase price of their holdings had been stated. On their return to the Colony, these gentlemen will be asked to furnish the details required and they will be forwarded to Your Lordship. There also some officers serving locally from whom full particulars have yet to be obtained and whose holdings appear on the list. These will be furnished to Your Lordship later.

5. The terms under which the Ex-Soldier Settlement farms are held have also not been shown as these are now under revision, and it would be impossible to give all particulars in this report without unduly delaying it.

6. The procedure laid down by Your Lordship in considering each case has been followed and, as Your Lordship will observe, it has only been necessary for the Governor-in-Council to refuse me application, that of Mr. Barker, who requested permission to rent land in a Native Reserve.

7. Bearing in mind the possible danger that an officer whose private interests are situated near his official station might be tempted to devote his energies

energies to developing his holding to the detriment of his public duties, after discussing the matter with my Executive Council I recently issued instructions to Provincial Commissioners and Heads of Departments that as far as possible officers are not to be posted in districts where their interests are located.

S. I trust that this action will meet with Your Lordship's approval.
