I have the honour to inform you that the mail from Addis arrived yesterday and as I have not heard from Mr Attili I do not consider it advisable to wait any longer before submitting my accounts. I will therefore submit as shortly and easily as possible the balance I have due over from BRIEFY INTALIA.

First of all whilst I was in England on leave the sum of £ 500 was sent to Gondar to be paid to you and at Addis to distribute it as per usual. A half a letter over of £ 22 which he returned to me and which I now take on charge.

On February 14th last after Attili's return from England fully transformed to us in his usual UNCLE like practices, he sent back my usual portion of the sum of £ 100 a month.

At Gondar Captain MacCormick informed me that the place where Attili had been unable to get a boat on the route and which I have now got UNQUOTE the required boat.

In addition the sum of £ 500 was sent to me by him of £ 100 monthly.

Therefore of course I take up an account for January 1st, 1919 as follows:

Sir,

I have the honour to forward the enclosed correspondence in connection with Major Athill's accounts.

It will be seen from paragraph 2 of his letter dated 10.10.19 (enclosure 4) that the statements of charges were prepared when I took over the balance from the bank, but as these have not been presented yet, although it is now a year since I took over the balance, there is evidently some mistake, viz. letter from bank dated 22.12.19. (enc 7).

Major Athill states in paragraph 2 of the same letter that he has paid £1000/- 20 cents ad mbo by account. This has not been done, viz. enclosure 7.

It appears also that a sum of £2175/- due to the Pay-master Egypt for equipment etc has not been paid (see enclosure 8), although it should have been done when Major Athill first came out in 1916. The articles mentioned therein have been taken on charge. I respectfully request that my estimates for this year will not be based upon this amount as I shall probably not have enough to meet it. I forward the account book with the request that you will kindly make the necessary arrangement. I believe you have correspondence with Major Athill on this subject before.

Will you please communicate direct with Major Athill on these matters as I am leaving for the South in a few days. It is hopeless for me to attempt to do so.

I regret the delay in forwarding you the information & accounts asked for by you. Communication from Asia was cut off early in March, so that while I received your letters written before your start to Parry's, the same only reached me three weeks ago. In the accounts there were several points which I could not solve without the Faint Pass Book and the notes I sent to you, of which unfortunately I kept no copy.

According to the statement sent me by the bank, you had over a bank balance of \$1755.00. According to your account book the balance was \$1843.00. It appears that of your taking over the following charges were impressed.

With regard to the Account Book Balances, it shows a total of \$284.36. There is a discrepancy in the above statement. This can easily be seen to explain it. The Bank have forwarded a cheque for the amount of \$100.00 at the Bank of Abyssinia.

3. Pasta and flour which had been obtained from the town to pay for two mules they lost with Captain Fentinel. The fresh mules were bought by Capt. Fentinel at \$100.00 each.

4. The clearing box was being used for experiments, labelling it and putting it in your kit.

A copy of the statement is enclosed. It shows that the amount of payment due the Bank from April to January was \$650, leaving a balance deposit in the bank which left, according to \$150.

Monthly cheques were sent by me to Addis Ababa to be  
converted to the suitable man in cash, and receipts were sent  
by Capt. Benjamins. It was only in November 1919 that I  
informed the most of the money was still in Addis Ababa  
in danger of sending it by mail. It was then arranged  
by Mr. Fiori and Mr. May 1920, before the time of  
writing, no news had been received as to whether he had got  
money or not.

Hope that these will help to clear up the whole for  
you a most heartily sorry and absolutely to blame.

Sir:-

I have the honour to acknowledge the receipt of your letter dated the seventh ultime.

(i) I think the accounts you mention are now clear when the few trivial alterations mentioned below are admitted.

(ii) You state that £450 and £100 were sent to Harar during my absence, making a total of £550.

As a matter of fact £516 was only received here.

The other £106 was sent down by the postmen. They said

there were robbers on the road so returned it to Alian Araba where it was left in a mail box until your return, so your best balance with the sum of £516 will be £450. The sum being equal £550.

(iii) The totals due to the men who I have paid from the balance to you since your return as a whole will be a total of £146.00 with the following exceptions:-

A. You show £6 paid to Sadiq on March 19. This is not right the amount was £16 and the remainder £10 which will therefore be necessary for you to remit to him.

B. The amount shown due to Nur who was £125.00 paid as he should have only received £8 per month for March and April 1918. It will therefore be necessary for you to remit £8.

C. £65 shown as paid to Alfashish, should have been £100, as he receives £10 per month. The balance of £11 is to be taken paid from your cash balance.

This will therefore leave it to you £11. The three items above summarised are as follows:-

A. £16

C. £11

B. £8 Balance due

Will you please pay in this balance of £6 to my official account, and return the paying in slip with the attached voucher. 158

(iv) The whole total due to Yero, plus deposit pay as shown by you equals £13. Out of this £8 has been paid leaving a balance of £28 unpaid which is still included in your balance and which I will pay later.

(v) I regret I am unable to collect the £8 shown as overpaid to Gutama as he left my service some months ago.

(vi) The £6 stopped from the men's pay for loss of mules etc. was presumably credited in your cash book and taken on charge and therefore is included in your balance.

(vii) I note that the sum of £941.17 was due to outstanding cheques when your balance was transferred to me and it will be necessary for me to deduct this sum from my cash returns. I have written to the bank to forward me a voucher to this effect.

Sir,

I have the honour to acknowledge with the deepest respect the receipt of your despatch No. 455/6/87 dated 16.3.89. with statement as stated.

1st. I can only repeat that on 1st Dec. 1918 I handed over to Mr. Campbell, H.M. Consul, Adis Ababa, the sum of £300 due to Government, as per my cash statement for Feb. 1918, and in addition the sum of £245 being amounts on account due to the following men. Fanta £120. S. Ali. £10. M. O. Mulla. Hannig. £10. Yero. £25.

2nd. That on my return to Adis Ababa I took on charge the sum of £4834.00 equalling Rupees 5936.00 as per my despatch to you dated 4.3.19.

3rd. It is practically impossible for me to do as you request:-

(a) I have not my cash-book for the period in question. It is in Major Athill's possession.

(b) I have not the authority, or sufficient experience in accounting, to pass Major Athill's accounts which can only be done by you.

(c) It would take months, leaving the above facts out of consideration before I could settle the matter by correspondence.

4th. I would therefore most respectfully request that you will ask Major Athill to furnish you with the necessary vouchers for the period he acted for me, and to forward to you any monies that are outstanding.

5th. Major Athill's address is War Office, London.
