I beg to inform you that Lieut. Hamilton Moore, M.L.C., has been awarded, upon the recommendation of the local Imperial Pensions Board and subject to confirmation by the East African Government, a pension of £52-10/- per annum for the period 10/4/19 to 31/10/19 conditional, less the period he was in hospital, viz 17/4/19 to 15/5/19 for which he was paid hospital allowance.

In addition to the above award, Mr Moore is still due hospital allowance at the rate of £175 per annum for the period 14-15/5/19, less 4/6d per diem hospital charges.

I shall be glad therefore, if you will arrange for payment in accordance with the above award and recover from the East African Government through the Agents for the Crown Colonies.
