Mrs. A.B. Maidment, widow of the late Corporal T. Maidment Tast Africa Military Labour Corps,

I am directed by the Minister of Pensions to refer to your letter makes at 14563/1920 of the 2nd July and previous correspondence relative to the case of the above named widow and to state for the information of the Secretary of State for the Colonies that no Supplementary Pension such as appears to have been granted to Mrs. Maidment by the Officer Administering the Government of the East Africa Protectorate is payable in respect of men who served index British Army Regulations.

It is observed that Mrs. Maidment claims that her husband earned from £20 to £40 a month as a master eaddler before he enlisted and it would appear that the might, therefore, be eli,ible for an Alternative Penaion based on his average sarvings prior to the war. It will, however, be necessary for the pre-war earnings to be carefully investigated and before an award can be made it will be necessary for the Ministry of Penaions to have evidence as to her entitlement to penaion, viz, that the late Corperal Maidment was (1) killed while in the performance of military duty during the sar or (2) died

The Under Secretary of State, Colonial Office, Downing Street, S.W.1. as a result of wounds or injuries received in the performance of such duty or (3) died of diseas certified as contracted or commencing while on active service during the war, or as having been aggravated by such active service, and that he was married to the applicant within the period require by the regulations. The amount of pension awarded would depend, also, on the age of the widow.

It is not considered possible for the Minis of Pensions to transfer the payment of a pension w is apparently not in accordance with the regulation but it is suggested that if you are in possession any documents proving Mrs. Maidment's entitlement flat-rate pension such as record of the services of the late Corporal Maidment, his death certificate. of marriage and the date from which first award of pension was payable etc., or can obtain same by me of a cabled inquiry to the Officer Administering the Government of the East Africa Protectorate, and wi forward them to this Department, it will be consid whether authority can be given for transference of payment of flat-rate pension to Buenos Aires and t question of Alternative Pension can then be taken up direct with the widow and the Military Pensions Commissioner, Pretoris. Should she be found eligi for an Alternative Pension it will probably be pose to effect an adjustment between the pension payabl under the 1919 Royal Warrant and the over-issue apparently already made.
