With further reference to the letter dated 25th May,
reference number as above and to your letter of 12th
December last reference *me* 67925/1919, in respect of the late
Lance Corporal Thomas Vincent Kiely, East African Transport
Corps, I am directed by the Minister of Pensions to acquaint
you that had the man been pensioned under British Army
Regulations, the question of compensation to his daughter
for the expenses incurred by her in consequence of his last
illness and death, would have been dealt with on the
following lines:-

A funeral grant not exceeding £4 would have been
considered if the funeral expenses would otherwise
have fallen on the rates.

A constant attendant's allowance in respect of
nursing during the man's last illness at a rate not
exceeding 20/- per week would also have been
considered.
