24. (d) What is the degree of disablement at which, in the Board's opinion, he should be assessed at present, independent of hospital or other treatment. 27. Do the Board find that the soldier has suffered any impairment in health since his entry into the Service?

28. Is treatment being recommended on Army Form B-173e?

29. Does the soldier require—

- (a) An attendant for his journey home?
- (b) Transport from railway station to his home?
- (c) The constant attendance of another person in his own home?

I am directed by the East African Currency Board to inform you that they propose, subject to the approval of the Secretary of State, to use the same designs for the new East African nickel-bronze subsidiary coins, viz. 10 cent, 5 cent, and 1 cent pieces, as those of the old East Africa and Uganda Protectorates nickel-bronze coins, with an alteration of the inscription on the reverses to "East Africa" as used in the case of the new silver coins.

A specimen 10 cent piece of the old design is enclosed for your examination.
