I am directed by the East African Currency Board to inform you that they propose, subject to the approval of the Secretary of State, to use the same designs for the new East African nickel-bronze subsidiary coins, viz.: 10 cent, 5 cent, and 1 cent pieces, as those of the old East African and Uganda Protectorates nickel-bronze coins, without alteration of the inscription on the reverses to "East Africa" as used in the case of the new silver coins.

A specimen 10 cent piece of the old design is enclosed for your examination.

I shall be glad to learn as soon as possible if the Secretary of State approves of this proposal.
