

Palace referred to in our official letter quoted above,  
has been made with the Ind. Pers. Office  
paying Imperial Pensions, Canada, <sup>in so</sup> <sup>far as</sup>  
the <sup>as</sup> <sup>to</sup> <sup>the</sup> <sup>same</sup> <sup>purpose</sup> <sup>of</sup> <sup>the</sup> <sup>Ind. P. and</sup>  
the <sup>and</sup> <sup>of</sup> <sup>general</sup> <sup>local</sup> <sup>offices</sup> <sup>resident</sup>  
in Canada are concerned. We have  
no record of any such arrangement and if  
one has been made by the Ind. P. we  
should be glad to receive copies of the  
correspondence relating to it. Perhaps  
the Ind. P. will communicate  
with the Office Paying Imperial Pensions  
Canada <sup>via</sup> with a view to arrangements to  
being made. Such arrangements would  
be precisely similar to those already in force  
with the Ind. Pers. Comm. Palace, with  
the exception that the security of the  
transmission approved by the Ind. P. would be  
made from the C.A. for the C.A. instead of  
from the local authority in C.A. concerned.  
We shall be glad of your views on this matter.

Recent experience shows that it  
would be desirable to insert at the end of the  
para. instructions to the effect that any  
communication which it may be desired to  
send from the Ind. P. to the local authority in  
C.A. regarding the <sup>Ind. P. and Imperial</sup> <sup>paying</sup>  
local offices should always be sent to the  
C.A. for transmission. This is a  
matter of detail, but it is important  
to be able to cause you and so considerable  
inconvenience.  
I think that these are the  
steps which we can afford to  
take.  
Perhaps you would be so good as to  
send a copy of the memo as finally approved  
and issued.
