I am directed by the Minister of Pensions to advert to Sir H.J. Read's letter of the 11th ultimo, No. 37776/1920, with which was forwarded a claim which had been received from the General Post Office in respect of retired pay to Rev. T.B.R. Verelstede and inform you that the account has been forwarded to the Paymaster General who is responsible for the payment of the Officer, and who will charge the amount on the Votes of this Ministry.

Recovery of the amount from the Crown will be effected by this Government. The amount concerned

is a sum of £1,000 charged to the account on the 1st April 1920, and is to be paid by the Office of Pensions. The amount is to be paid to the account in respect of payment made on behalf of His Majesty's Government, which charge is borne on the Votes of the various Government Departments concerned.
