Sir,

Adverting to your letter of the 3rd June, 1918, No. 26070/18, directed by the Minister of Pensions to inform you that the widow of Captain (Hon. Major) R.L. Stevenson, unattached list, East Africa, has now been awarded a pension at the rate of £168 a year with effect from 1st April, 1920.

An allowance of £36 a year with effect from the same date has also been awarded to her for each of her three children, who are under the prescribed ages.

These awards are at the rates provided by the Royal Warrant of the 2nd July, 1920, for a widow over 40 years of age, or with a child eligible for an allowance, of a Captain who died of disease attributable to or aggravated by Military Service, and include an addition (war bonus) in consideration of the present increased cost of living and that addition is not liable to withdrawal or reduction through a decrease in such cost before the 1st April, 1923.

These awards are charged against Colonial Funds, and the necessary recoveries will be made from time to time in usual manner.
