My Lord,

With reference to Colonel Amery's Confidential despatch of 8th January, relating to the cultivation of maize at Mount Marsabit, I have the honour to inform Your Lordship that the crop has unfortunately again proved a failure. The acreage planted was considerably increased this year; the rains however failed completely and as a consequence only 1800 lbs of maize have been reaped.

2. In the absence of rainfall records prior to 1918 at Marsabit, it is impossible to say what is the average yearly rainfall there. If the amount which has fallen in recent years is up to the average, the experiment appears to be doomed to failure.

3. It is however believed that the last 3 years have been exceptionally dry and I am of opinion that further planting should be undertaken before the scheme is condemned and abandoned.


