Proposed Revised Categories of persons who will be recommended for priority passages to East Africa after the 15th of February, 1920.

I. Persons who will be specially recommended for immediate passages:-

(a) Persons regarding whom it is certified by one of the Medical Advisers to the Colonial Office that there is serious danger to their lives or the risk of permanent injury to their health if they remain in the United Kingdom, and who can show that they either have urgent business reasons for going to East Africa or that they cannot afford to go anywhere else.

(b) Medical practitioners who wish to proceed to East Africa in order to practise their profession.

II. Persons who will be recommended for ordinary priority passages:-

(a) Proprietors of existing businesses or farms in East Africa, which are managed by themselves, who left East Africa before the 15th of February 1920, and who can show that the arrangements made for carrying on their work during their absence are not such as to permit of delay in their return.

(b) Persons required to relieve members of firms etc., in East Africa, who are obliged to leave East Africa for health reasons. Such persons may, if it is considered necessary, be required to obtain confirmation from the appropriate Government, at their own expense, that the application is made in good faith and that local arrangements cannot be made for carrying on the

(c) Wives and children of persons ordinarily resident in East Africa. These recommendations will be granted in the same way as at present.

(Note:- In addition to the above there may be cases from time to time of persons granted land under the East African Land Settlement Scheme who were not able to sail by the S.S. "Garth Castle", and who have not yet been recommended for priority. These cases would require special consideration).

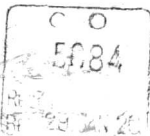

The British Committee of the Indian National Congress desires to draw the attention of the public in the Colonies, and the British public to the Ordinance which was to have been placed before the Legislative Council of the East African Protectorate on January 19th by which "any person within the East African Protectorate, not being a native, who has information officially received or deemed by the Governor in Council to be undesirable, or ordered by the Governor to remove himself from the Protectorate, before a date prescribed in such orders".

This Ordinance apart from its inherent injustice, is a monstrous infringement of the rights of the Indian community in East Africa, by whose energies and wealth the prosperity of the Protectorate has been so largely built up and the Committee urges most strongly that it should be disallowed by the Imperial Government.
