66. At 1 February. Following telegram is sent at request of
British Congress. To Sir. Indian Congress Committee humbly
submit that Traders Association Finance (Circular) which
came into operation last January will prove to be absolutely
destructive Indian trade in last quarter. Indian Community most
strongly protests and urges for withdrawal, auction and
immediate suspension until consideration of my Committee's
representations which are being forwarded. Yours, General
