
Sir,

With reference to the correspondence ending with Sir J. Read's letter of 27th May 1915, No. 24014/1915, I am directed by the Secretary of State for India to transmit for the consideration of Viscount Milner a copy of a letter from the Government of India, in which they recommend the conditional retention for a further period of five years of the clerk employed hitherto under the C. & I. dated 24th Jan. 1920. SIR,

WITH reference to the correspondence ending with the letter from the India Office No. J. & P. 2090, dated the 1st June 1915, we have the honour to forward copy of a letter No. 208, dated the 8th January 1920, and of its enclosures, which we have received from the Government of Bombay, submitting a proposal to grant a further extension of service to the clerk employed at Karachi in connection with the emigration of Indian coolies for the Uganda Railway, and to transfer him from the office of the Protector of Emigrants, Karachi, to that of the Protector of Emigrants, Bombay.

2. We agree in the recommendations of the Local Government for the transfer of the clerk from Karachi to Bombay and for his retention for a further period of five years with effect from the 1st April 1920, subject to the condition that the clerk may be discharged if at any time within that period his services cease to be required. We accordingly request that arrangements may be made for the payment of the clerk's salary by the Uganda Railway and sanction given to his transfer from Karachi to Bombay.

I AM directed to refer to the correspondence ending with the letter from the Government of India, No. 10707-7, dated the 6th July 1915, conveying the sanction of the Secretary of State to the retention of the services of the clerk employed at Karachi in connection with the emigration of Indian coolies for the Uganda Railway for a period of five years from the 1st April 1915, and to forward herewith, for the information of the Government of India, a copy of a letter from the Protector of Emigrants, Karachi, addressed to the Commissioner in Sind, No. 462, dated the 3rd December 1919, and accompaniment submitting a proposal to grant a farther extension of service to the clerk and to transfer him from the office of the Protector of Emigrants, Karachi, to that of the Protector of Emigrants, Bombay. It will be seen that the Uganda Railway authorities propose to transfer their Agency from Karachi to Bombay as the latter place is considered by them to be more convenient. The Governor in Council has no objection to the transfer of the clerk's service from Karachi to Bombay and to its retention for a further period of five years with effect from the 1st April 1920, subject to the condition that the clerk will be discharged if at any time within that period, his services cease to be required, and I am to request that the Government of India may be moved to recommend these proposals for the favourable consideration of His Majesty's Secretary of State for India.

I HAVE the honour to forward a copy of letter No. A-358, dated the 2nd December 1919, received from the Agents in India, Uganda Railway, Karachi, and to state that I have no objection to the emigration clerk being transferred to Bombay, Protector of Emigrants' Office, for the Emigration work of the Uganda Railway.

The present clerk, Mr A. B. Kotwal, though on a temporary Establishment, has been continuously working in this office for the past 11 years, and carried out his duties very satisfactorily.

I may here point out that the five years period for which the clerk's services were further retained under Government Order No. 5634, dated the 16th July 1915, General Department, expires on 31st March 1920, and under the circumstances explained in the Agents' letter referred to above, sanction for a further extension of the period for the retention of the clerk is necessary.

I am forwarding a copy of this letter to the Agents in India, Uganda Railway, Karachi, for information.

The General Manager of the Uganda Railway informs us that he intends to transfer the Agency of the Railway in India from Karachi to Bombay which

"The present arrangement regarding the clerk employed in Karachi in
connection with the Emigration of coolies to East Africa is that
he shall continue his duties till 31st March 1920, but may be
discharged before that date if at any time his services cease to be
required."

"I am quite prepared to carry on the present arrangement until the 31st
March 1920, but from the 1st April I would like the Agency to
open at Bombay and should be glad to hear if you would recom-
mend the transference of the present clerk to Bombay as I
understand the Emigration Agent has to be a person not a firm."
